

University policy on Plagiarism:

DO NOT:

- copy sentences, phrases or paragraphs without acknowledgement
- incorporate material from books, journals, the internet, another student or any other source without acknowledgement
- submit work for assessment that purports to be your own work but is in fact jointly written with another student or other students (collusion)
- submit material that is identical or substantially similar to material which has already been submitted for the same or any other programme at this University or elsewhere (self-plagiarism)

Canterbury Christ Church University now uses Turnitin on most assessments to match any text found online or EVER submitted to Turnitin here or at any other University
